Associated Oregon Industries' PROPOSED BUDGET for Intervenor Funding Issue Fund Grant

Associated Oregon Industries (AOI) hereby submits its Proposed Budget in support of a request for an Intervenor Funding Issue Fund Grant for the UM 1121 proceeding in the amount of \$55,000 from the Portland General Electric (PGE) Issue Fund. AOI respectfully requests expedited action on this Proposed Budget, within 14 days or less as provided in Section 6.4 of the Intervenor Funding Agreement (IFA) adopted by the Oregon Public Utility Commission ("Commission") by Order No. 03-388 (July 2, 2003). In support of this request, AOI provides the following:

A. UM 1121 is an "eligible proceeding" within the definition of Section 1(b) of the IFA.

UM 1121 directly affects PGE, a Participating Public Utility under Section 1(k) of the IFA.

B. AOI filed a timely Petition to Intervene in the UM 1121 proceeding on April 29, 2004. AOI filed a timely Notice of Intent to seek an Issue Fund Grant when it submitted its Petition to Intervene on April 29, 2004, as required by Section 6.2 of the IFA. AOI timely filed a Petition Requesting Case-Certification at the time it submitted its Notice of Intent on April 29, 2004, as required by Section 6.2 of the IFA. AOI's Petition to Intervene was granted May 6,

2004. AOI's Petition Requesting Case-Certification was approved by the Commission by Order

No. 04-303 entered on May 27, 2004. In that order, the Commission directed AOI to submit a

proposed budget within 14 calendar days. AOI's Proposed Budget is timely filed well in

advance of that deadline.

C. Section 6.4 of the IFA provides that the Commission will act upon proposed budgets

within 14 days of receiving the proposed budget. Given that the first settlement conference in

the UM 1121 case is scheduled for June 8-9 and intervenor testimony is due in six weeks, AOI

respectfully requests expedited action on this proposed budget so that AOI will know what

resources it has available to participate effectively in the case.

D. Section 6.3 of the IFA specifies five elements that the Proposed Budget must include.

AOI submits the following in compliance with that requirement:

(1) Statement of the work to be performed. AOI is seeking the Issue Fund Grant in order to

hire outside counsel to represent the interests of a broad cross-section of commercial, retail, and

service-industry customers in the UM 1121 proceeding. To maximize efficient utilization of

Intervenor Funds, AOI will attempt to coordinate its positions and involvement with other

parties, including Precertified Intervenors. AOI will review and analyze the testimony of the

applicants, staff, and other intervenors. AOI will identify issues and develop positions on behalf

of the broad base of commercial customers. AOI will actively participate in workshops and

settlement conferences. AOI will participate in targeted portions of hearings as issues warrant

and funds permit. AOI may file its own testimony and/or collaborate on, contribute to, and co-

sponsor testimony with other intervenors, depending on the issues that develop in this case,

AOI's and others' position on those issues, and the availability of Intervenor Funds. AOI may

file its own brief and/or collaborate on, contribute to, and co-sponsor briefs with other

intervenors. AOI will be actively involved in settlement negotiations.

(2) Description of the areas to be investigated by the intervenor.

AOI intends to investigate how the application of the Oregon Electric Utility Company,

LLC, et al., to acquire PGE impacts commercial customers of PGE, including hospitals,

restaurants, retailers, small manufacturers and service industry providers. AOI's focus in the

proceeding will be primarily directed at the impact on PGE's rates, quality of service, and terms

and conditions of service to these commercial customers. AOI will examine whether, from the

commercial customer's perspective, the acquisition "will serve the public utility's customers in

the public interest" as required under ORS 757.511(3). AOI will investigate what conditions of

approval, if any, would be necessary to assure the acquisition serves customers, in the present

and over the long-term, should approval of the application be warranted. AOI submitted an Issue

List in the case on May 13, 2004. In addition to the issues identified in that submission, AOI

will review the issues raised by other intervenors and the Commission staff and respond to those

issues from the perspective of commercial customers' interests.

(3) Description of the particular customer class or classes that will benefit from AOI's

participation.

AOI is the state's largest business association, representing over 20,000 businesses in the

state. These businesses include hospitals, restaurants, small manufacturers, retailers, and other

commercial businesses. This broad cross-section of commercial customers has been historically

underrepresented in proceedings before the Commission. AOI seeks to remedy that gap by

advocating for their interests in UM 1121, thus assuring they have a voice in the critical issues

ASSOCIATED OREGON INDUSTRIES 1149 COURT STREET NE SALEM, OR 97301-4030 that surround the acquisition of PGE. AOI will direct its efforts for the benefit of this broad

cross-section of commercial customers.

(4) Identification of the specific Fund account.

AOI is seeking an Issue Fund Grant from the PGE Issue Fund Account for 2004, which

Fund includes a carry-over balance from 2003.

(5) Budget showing estimated attorney and consultant fees and expert witness fees.

AOI submits the proposed budget attached on page 6. AOI will use the Intervenor

Funding Grant to hire an outside attorney and possibly a consultant to assist AOI in this effort.

AOI does not have in-house legal expertise or funds available for this project without this

Intervenor Funding Grant. Therefore, AOI respectfully requests that the Commission not

impose a matching fund requirement on the Issue Fund Grant awarded to AOI. (Such

requirement is allowed for, but not required, as a condition of Issue Fund Grants under Section

6.5 of the IFA.) However, AOI will contribute wages for in-house professional and clerical staff,

and related in-house costs, in direct support of AOI's participation in this proceeding. AOI will

maximize the value of the Intervenor Funding Grant awarded by the Commission by

participating in the most targeted and cost-effective manner to make a substantive contribution to

the record in this case on behalf of a broad base of commercial customers.

WHEREFORE, AOI respectfully requests that the Commission issue an order awarding an Issue Fund Grant to AOI in the amount of \$55,000.
