SCHEDULE 125 (Continued)

PART C – MID YEAR PRICING OPTION TRANSITION

Part C is applicable to Consumers who make an election pursuant to the Special Mid-Year 2005 Price Option Election under Schedule 83. Part C shall reflect the difference between the energy charge(s) under the Cost of Service Option and the market price of power for the period July 1, 2005 through December 31, 2005 based on the load of the Consumers selecting alternatives.

The Company will file and post Part C adjustment rates on its website (www.PortlandGeneral.biz) by 2 p.m. PPT, on May 16, 2005. Part C will terminate January 1, 2006.

If the deviation between the market prices used to establish the Part C Adjustment Rate and the actual prices experienced in disposing of the load for Consumers who give notice mid-year is greater than \$250,000, the Company shall include the deviation amount in the 2006 Schedule 125, Part A rate calculation for Large Nonresidential Consumers.
