In the Matter of the Application of Portland General Electric Company for an Order Approving the Deferral of Direct and Indirect Costs and the Balance of the Residential Exchange Application For Deferral Of Residential Exchange Costs and Balance

Pursuant to ORS 757.259 and OAR 860-027-0300, Portland General Electric Company ("PGE") hereby requests authorization to defer for later ratemaking treatment direct and indirect costs as well as balances resulting from the administration of the Residential Exchange Program under the Pacific Northwest Electric Power Planning and Conservation Act of 1980 (the "Northwest Power Act"), and PGE's Schedule 102 (the "Deferred Amount"). PGE seeks authorization to defer the Deferred Amount more fully described below effective with this filing, through December 31, 2007 (the "Deferral Period"). PGE will seek amortization of the Deferred Amount in a future Commission proceeding.

PGE is filing this Application out of an abundance of caution. Since 1992 deferrals have not been filed for these pass-through credits. PGE is filing this Application, however, because the Bonneville Power Administration ("BPA") has notified PGE that it is immediately suspending payments under the agreements PGE entered into with BPA due to the decisions of the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals referenced below. PGE's Schedule 102 currently credits customers for the benefits received from BPA. As a result of BPA's actions, PGE has made an Advice Filing to change Schedule 102 to cease passing-through the benefits effective June 1, 2007. However,

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if that Advice Filing is implemented as requested, PGE will pay customers an estimated \$2.1 million more than PGE has received from BPA. Because of the uncertainty of the situation, and to be cautious, PGE is filing this Application for deferral of the amount paid to customers in excess of the benefits received from BPA.

I. The following is provided pursuant to OAR 860-027-0300(3):

a. <u>Description</u>

Section 5(c)(3) of the Northwest Power Act requires that all Residential Exchange benefits be passed through directly to residential and small farm customers. In 2000, PGE signed a contract with BPA regarding the Residential Exchange, pursuant to OPUC Order Nos. 00-678 and 01-427, and ORS 757.663, for the period October 2001 thru September 2011. The benefits have been credited to customers through tariff Schedule 102. As a result of two decisions issued on May 3, 2007, by the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals, BPA notified PGE by letter dated May 21, 2007, that BPA would make no further Residential Exchange payments to PGE. PGE is seeking Commission permission to suspend credits under Schedule 102, effective June 1, 2007.

b. Reasons for Deferral

Although PGE will, if approved by the Commission, suspend credits under Schedule 102 on June 1, 2007, PGE will overpay Residential Exchange benefits to its residential and small farm customers by an estimated \$2.1 million. Per ORS 757.259 (1), (2)(b) and (2)(c), PGE seeks to defer any overpayment to customers for later amortization in rates.

c. Proposed Accounting

PGE currently maintains a balancing account to track the difference between benefits

provided by BPA to PGE and benefits provided by PGE to customers through Schedule 102. The balancing account is recorded in either FERC Account 182.3 (Regulatory Asset) when benefits provided to customers exceed benefits provided from BPA or in FERC Account 254 (Regulatory Liability) when benefits provided to customers are less than those provided from BPA. PGE debits (amortizes) the balancing account based on the rate credits provided to customers through Schedule 102 (FERC Account 440, Residential Sales). PGE credits the balancing account based on benefits received from BPA.

PGE is not seeking to change its accounting of the BPA balancing account with this deferral application.

d. Estimate of Amounts

PGE estimates that the Deferred Amount will be about \$2.1 million. The exact amount will depend on the date credits under Schedule 102 are suspended, and on customer usage before that date. Amounts deferred will accrue interest at PGE's authorized cost of capital.

e. Notice

A copy of the Notice of Application for Deferral of Residential Exchange Costs and Balances and a list of persons served with the Notice are attached to the Application as Attachment A.
