Request for a General Rate Revision.

DISPOSITION: SCOPE OF HEARING DISCUSSED; DEADLINE ESTABLISHED FOR CROSS-EXAMINATION STATEMENTS

A hearing before the Public Utility Commission of Oregon (Commission) in this matter is currently set for Monday, November 2, 2009.

Scope. The hearing will address any objections filed by the parties on Wednesday, October 21, 2009, contesting the revenue-requirement stipulation filed in this docket. The hearing may also include questions from the Commission regarding provisions of the revenue-requirement stipulation.

Witnesses. Witnesses raising and responding to objections to the revenue-requirement stipulation should plan to attend the hearing. Because the Commission may have other questions about the stipulation, the parties should plan to have witnesses attend the hearing who can answer with authority any question directed to the revenue-requirement stipulation. At a minimum, this should include witnesses from Pacific Power and Staff, but the witnesses of any party supporting the revenue-requirement stipulation are welcome to attend and weigh in on any issues that may be raised.

Prefiled Testimony. In order to ensure a complete record, prefiled testimony in this docket will be made part of the record. Witnesses who testify during the hearing should plan to sponsor their prefiled testimony when they testify. For all other witnesses, affidavits should be submitted during the hearing in support of the remaining prefiled testimony. Any objections to the admission of prefiled testimony will be addressed during the hearing.

Cross-Examination Statements. Cross-examination statements are to be filed by <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>October 28, 2009</u>. Cross-examination statements should identify the witness to be examined, the subject matter of the proposed cross-examination, and the anticipated time needed for cross-examination.
