10	I. INTRODUCTION		
11	Idaho Power Company ("Idaho Power" or "the Company") submits the following		
12	comments in the above-referenced proceeding pursuant to the Ruling issued by		
13	Administrative Law Judge ("ALJ") Patrick Power on January 9, 2012. These comments		
14	pertain only to the determination of the appropriate Volumetric Incentive Rate ("VIR") for the		
15	April 2012 enrollment period for the Solar Photovoltaic ("PV") Pilot Program established by		
16	House Bill 3039.		
17	II. BACKGROUND		
18	After each Solar PV Pilot Program enrollment period, the Commission has the		
19	opportunity to adjust the VIR in response to participation levels in the enrollment period.		
20	When the Solar PV Pilot Program began, the Commission adopted an automatic rate		
21	adjustment mechanism ("ARAM"). Under this original ARAM, if the available capacity is fully		
22	subscribed within the first three months of the enrollment period, there is a rebuttable

1 presumption that the VIR should be decreased by 10 percent for the next enrollment period.²

2 This ARAM was designed for a first-come, first-served enrollment process.

3 In Order No. 11-089, issued on March 17, 2011, the Commission modified the

4 enrollment program for small-scale systems and required PacifiCorp and Portland General

5 Electric Company ("PGE") to implement a lottery system for capacity allocation.³ Idaho

6 Power, however, was not required to implement a lottery system and instead maintained the

7 existing first-come, first-served enrollment process.4 In that same order, the Commission

8 postponed Idaho Power's last scheduled enrollment period from April 2011 to October 2011.

9 Thereafter, in Order No. 11-280, issued on July 29, 2011, the Commission

10 established the VIR for the October 2011 enrollment period. Citing the overwhelming

11 demand for capacity and declining bid prices for large projects, the Commission lowered the

12 VIR 20 percent.⁵ As a result, Idaho Power's VIR was set at 31.7 cents for the October 2011

13 enrollment period.

14 In Order No. 11-339, the Commission modified the ARAM. Because PacifiCorp and

15 PGE would be using a lottery-based enrollment process, the Commission revised the ARAM

16 to create rebuttable presumptions related to VIR adjustments based generally on the ratio of

17 capacity requests received versus available capacity.6
