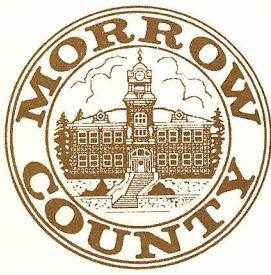

While we would prefer to see the plant operate through 2040 with additional environmental controls, PGE's 2020 plan offers the best alternative. It provides adequate time to put a reliable replacement generation resource in place and meets the state's aggressive environmental objectives. Most importantly, the 10-year time frame protects this region and the state from the severe economic blow that would result from a 2014 closure, which some environmental groups are advocating.

The economic vitality of Oregon's rural communities is of great importance to the state. PGE's Boardman Plant has been an important economic engine in Morrow, Umatilla and surrounding counties. It generates significant tax dollars for this region, representing a critical funding source for our schools, libraries, roads and infrastructure. The family-wage jobs at the Boardman plant are also important to our rural economy. Boardman employs 110 full-time employees, about 25 contractors and 225 seasonal maintenance workers at the plant – employees who live and play an active role in Morrow, Umatilla and surrounding counties. PGE's 2020 plan allows a reasonable timeframe for these employees to transition to other jobs, including the potential to take jobs created at new generating plants under consideration in the region.

Living alongside the Columbia River, it is important to add that we also want to see environmental standards in place that will preserve its beauty for future generations. PGE's 2020 proposal accomplishes that, reducing emissions during the plant's remaining years by installing new mercury and nitrogen oxide controls and making other operational changes, while ending all coal-related emissions from Boardman at least 20 years ahead of schedule.

PGE's proposal is a balanced plan that meets both the environmental and economic interests of Oregon and its citizens. We respectfully request the Oregon Public Utility Commission and the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality provide the necessary rule changes and acknowledgements required for PGE to legally pursue its 2020 plan for the Boardman Plant set forth in its revised Integrated Resource Plan (LC 48) and petition to amend the Regional Haze Rule.

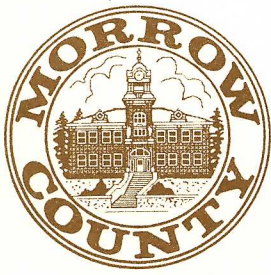

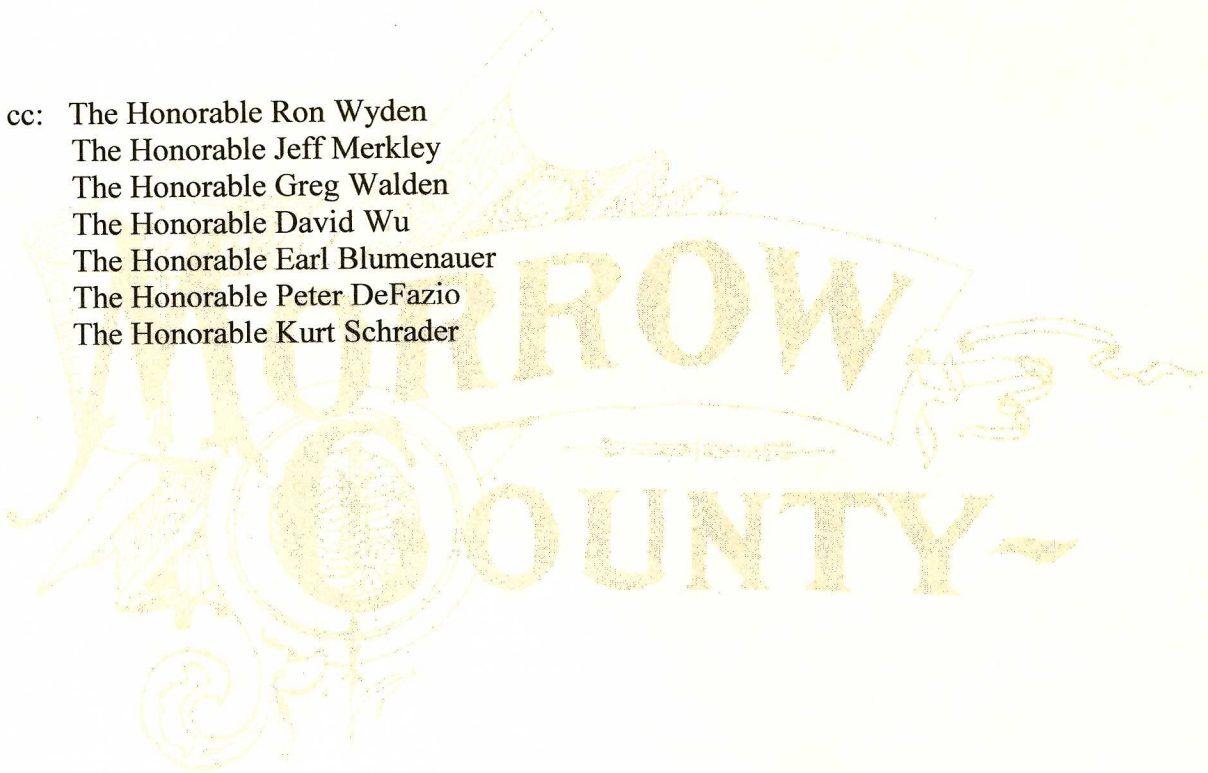


