Dear Ms. Baily-Goggins:

This letter is being filed supplemental to Roats Water System Inc's (Roats or Company) affiliated interest application, which is docketed by the Public Utility Commission as UI-326.

According to OAR 860-036-0739(4)(e), affiliated interest expenses should be at the lower of cost or market. Roats, in conjunction with its filed application, hereby requests a waiver of said rule for this specific affiliated interest application. Because the property has been owned for many years, its accounting cost is significantly lower than its market value. The owner of the property has not charged the Company rent in the past; therefore, the Company's revenue requirement has been less than it otherwise would have been. This means customers pay less for water service.

However, at this time, the owner of the property has the ability to sell or rent the property for greater than the cost of the property. The Company would likely have difficulty finding another suitable property in a desirable location at a reasonable cost on which to operate its business. Should the owner decide to sell or rent it to another entity, customers of the Company would likely end up paying more in expenses (rental and relocation) than the amount being requested in this application for rental expense. Therefore, granting this waiver is in the public interest, as customers would likely pay more if this waiver were not granted. Further details of the reasons for the request are also already generally set forth in the application.
