In compliance with ORS 757.205 and OAR 860-022-0025, PacifiCorp d/b/a Pacific Power (PacifiCorp or Company) submits for filing the proposed tariff pages associated with Tariff P.U.C. OR No. 36, which sets forth all rates, tolls, charges, rules, and regulations applicable to electric service in Oregon. The Company respectfully requests an effective date of October 7, 2015. A less than statutory notice waiver has been included with this filing.

Seventh Revision Sheet No. 91-1 Schedule 91 Low Income Bill Payment

Assistance Fund

The purpose of this filing is to extend the temporary increase to the low income assistance charge for an additional 24-month period in compliance with House Bill 3257.

Attachment A to this filing provides the calculation of the rate for the additional funds, which was calculated in conjunction with Portland General Electric Company (PGE). The current rate of \$0.34 per month will stay the same based on 2016 projected residential customer count for PacifiCorp and PGE.

The Company is revising Schedule 91 to update the expiration date of the \$0.34 residential low income adder to October 4, 2017, on the tariff page.

Purpose

The purpose of this Schedule is to collect funds for electric low-income bill payment assistance as specified in ORS 757.612 Section (7)(b) and in ORS 757.612 Section 3.

Applicable

To all bills for electric service calculated under all tariffs and contracts.

Adjustment Rates

The applicable Adjustment Rates are listed below. Retail electricity Consumers shall not be required to pay more than \$500 per month per site for low-income electric bill payment assistance.

Definition of Site (Order No. 01-073 entered January 3, 2001)

"Site" means:

- (a) Buildings and related structures that are interconnected by facilities owned by a single retail electricity consumer and that are served through a single electric meter; or
- (b) A single contiguous area of land containing buildings or other structures that are separated by not more than 1,000 feet, such that:
 - Each building or structure included in the site is no more than 1,000 feet from at least İ. one other building or structure in the site;
 - Buildings and structures in the site, and land containing and connecting buildings and ii. structures in the site, are owned by a single retail electricity consumer who is billed for electricity use at the buildings and structures; and
 - iii. Land shall be considered to be contiguous even if there is an intervening public or railroad right of way, provided that rights of way land, on which municipal infrastructure facilities exist (such as street lighting, sewerage transmission, and roadway controls), shall not be considered contiguous.
