Section 7.3(b)—SBUA has been an active participant in this docket. SBUA intervened, procured technical input, produced detailed comment. The expenses included in the Confidential Exhibit A are reasonable and directly attributable to SBUA’s participation in UM 1790.

Section 7.3(c)—The ALJ approved SBUA’s Amended proposed budget on December 6, 2016. In addition, SBUA used its own funds to pay for at least 20% of the Eligible Expenses as required by Sections 6.5 & 7.3(c) of the IFA.

Section 7.3(d)—This Request for Payment constitutes a Final Request for Payment in this Docket.

Section 7.4—All of the expenses included Exhibit A are Eligible Expenses as defined in Section 7.4 of the IFA because they relate to services provided or expenses incurred by SBUA’s outside legal counsel and SBUA staff. Relevant non-privileged documents substantiating the Eligible Expenses in Exhibit A are available for Commission audit, if requested, pursuant to Section 7.10 of the IFA.

The IFA states that the granting of “an Issue Fund Grant shall constitute a binding obligation on the Commission to order reimbursement of Eligible Expenses.” IFA Sec. 6.5. Likewise, the intervenor funding rules adopted by the Commission provide that the “[t]he terms of an [intervenor funding] agreement are binding on all organizations seeking a grant under that agreement and will be followed by the Commission in administering the agreement.” OAR Sec. 860-001-0120(2). SBUA has satisfied the terms of the IFA and respectfully requests that the Commission approve final payment of SBUA’s Issue Fund Grant in the amount of \$1,765 from the 2016 PacifiCorp Issue Fund within 30 days of receiving this Request for Payment as provided in Section 7.6 of the IFA.

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
