RULING

DISPOSITION: MOTION TO ADMIT COUNSEL *PRO HAC VICE*
GRANTED

On October 25, 2017, the Laborers' International Union of North America, its affiliated District Council, and Local Unions serving or located in Oregon filed a motion to allow David William Masamisu Fujimoto to appear as counsel *pro hac vice* in this proceeding. The affidavit of David W.M. Fujimoto accompanied the motion. David W.M. Fujimoto states that he will associate with Charles D. Colett, an active member in good standing with the Oregon State Bar.

I have reviewed the motion for admission *pro hac vice* and find that it complies with the requirements of UTCR 3.170 and OAR 860-001-0320. No objections have been received.

The motion to admit David William Masamisu Fujimoto as counsel *pro hac vice* on behalf of the Laborers' International Union of North America, its affiliated District Council, and Local Unions serving or based in Oregon is granted for a one-year period. For cases continuing over one year, an attorney appearing *pro hac vice* must file a new application to continue to participate in the case.¹
