REQUEST OF WALMART INC. AND SAM'S WEST, INC. TO APPEAR TELEPHONICALLY

EXPEDITED CONSIDERATION REQUESTED

On October 18, 2018, the Public Utility Commission of Oregon ("Commission") issued Notice of Oral Argument in this proceeding scheduling oral argument for November 6 at 1:30 p.m. Walmart Inc. and Sam's West, Inc. ("Walmart") requests permission from the Commission to appear telephonically for the oral argument scheduled for November 6. In support thereof, Walmart states as follows:

There remain five (5) issues to be decided by the Commission in this matter: (1) Open Access; (2) PGE's request to modify the existing Level III Storm accrual mechanism to allow negative as well as positive balances; (3) PGE's request to revise the normal weather assumption used in load forecasting by moving from a 15-year rolling average of historic temperatures to use of a trended weather assumption; (4) PGE's proposed changes to its existing decoupling mechanism, including (a) eliminating the Lost Revenue Recovery Adjustment ("LRRA") and replacing it with the Sales Normalization Adjustment ("SNA"), (b) expanding use of decoupling by applying SNA to larger non-residential schedules, (c) removing the weather normalization adjustment from the SNA, and (d) allowing the carry forward to future years the adjustment amounts in excess of the current two percent limiter; and (5) PGE's proposal to include energy storage associated with renewable resources in tariff Schedule 122.

Of these five remaining issues, Walmart has taken a position on only one—the proposed

changes to the decoupling mechanism. And with respect to that one issue, Walmart has taken a

position on only one of the four (4) sub-issues— expanding decoupling by application of the

SNA to Schedules 83 and 85. Given the limited nature of Walmart's position, Walmart requests

permission to appear at the November oral argument telephonically.

Walmart has conferred with the other parties in this matter. Portland General Electric

("PGE"), Staff, Oregon Citizens' Utility Board ("CUB"), the Alliance of Western Energy

Consumers ("AWEC") and Fred Meyer stated that they have no objection to Walmart appearing

telephonically.

Under the normal timing for motions and responses, responses must be filed within 15

days of the initiating motion. Fifteen days from today is November 6, the date of the oral

argument. Thus, the Commission would not have time under the normal motion procedures to

issue a timely decision. Therefore, Walmart requests expedited consideration of this motion.
