The work has and will include review of work plans and attending workshops. It has and will include working with other community based energy advocates to analyze the topics, data and prepare joint comments. It has and may include surveying data, identifying and assessing models to reduce energy burdens, research on numerous procedural aspects of such a program, like eligibility, enrollment, and arrearage management. It has and will include investigation of all other issues raised and information provided by staff, other participants and presenting experts during the proceedings.

During the applicability of the HB 2475 Interim Funding Agreement, Rogue Climate has relied and will rely on counsel to assist with funding applications and proceedings and seeks funding to cover some of the cost of that assistance.
