RE: MCI Communications Services, Inc. Notice of Grandfathering and Eventual Discontinuance of Providing Postpaid Calling Card Access to Verizon Long Distance Voice Service (“Verizon Enterprise Solutions Calling Card”) to Enterprise and Government Customers

Pursuant to OAR 860-032-011, MCI Communications Services, Inc. hereby notifies the Public Utilities Commission of Oregon that it intends to grandfather and eventually discontinue providing postpaid Calling Card access to Verizon Long Distance Voice Service (“Verizon Enterprise Solutions Calling Card”) to enterprise and government Customers. On or after September 30, 2014 MCI Communications Services will no longer accept new orders for Verizon Enterprise Solutions Calling Card. Except as required by contract, MCI Communications Services intends to discontinue Verizon Enterprise Solutions Calling Card service to Customers on or after November 30, 2014. Until it discontinues the service, MCI Communications Services plans to grandfather Verizon Enterprise Solutions Calling Card and to continue to serve existing Customers in accordance with applicable contracts.

As of July 28, 2014, MCI Communications Services had 429 enterprise and government Customers with locations in Oregon. No other providers are affected by this action.

On July 28, 2014 MCI Communications Services provided notice to potentially affected customers. A copy of the notice is attached. With a planned discontinuance no earlier than November 30, 2014, the notice satisfies the 90-day advance notice required by 860-032-011.

RE: Decommissioning Calling Card Services

Dear Valued Customer:

In May, we let you know that as we continue to optimize our service portfolio in order to serve you better and enable you to embrace innovative advancements for your business, Verizon Enterprise Solutions intends to decommission Calling Card access to Verizon Long Distance Voice Service, which is provided by MCI Communications Services, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as "VES Calling Card").

As an update, we now plan to stop supporting requests for VES Calling Card Move/Add/Change activities beginning on or after September 30, 2014, except for those requests submitted pursuant to a contract that specifically states that such activities must be supported through the term of the contract. Following the expiration of your current contract term after September 30, 2014, no contract renewals or extensions will be permitted.

As we mentioned in our May correspondence, if you have end users who are using VES Calling Cards, they will no longer be active when the platform is decommissioned on or after November 30, 2014, subject to contractual obligations.

These changes will take effect wherever VES Calling Cards are provided throughout the United States, including the District of Columbia, U.S. Territories, Wake Island, and Midway Island.

Please note that this notice does not affect agreements you may have with Verizon Enterprise Solutions or affiliated Verizon companies for any other service.
