RE: Advice No. 15-29 Withdrawal of Schedule 730 Power Quality Products and Services

Portland General Electric (PGE) submits this filing pursuant to Oregon Revised Statutes 757.205 and 757.210, and Oregon Administrative Rule (OAR) 860-022-0025, for filing a proposed tariff sheet associated with Tariff P.U.C. No. 18, with a requested effective date of <u>January 1, 2016</u>:

PGE hereby amends its tariff to withdraw Schedule 730 Power Quality Products and Services tariff sheets due to low enrollment in the surge suppressor product and services program. The program provides customers with products that protect specific electronic equipment from potential power surges and spikes. While originally offered in 2003, the program was closed to new service in 2009, with the filing of Advice 09-20. This was due to low customer participation and the increased availability of similar products in the retail market.

PGE is now terminating its Schedule 730 products and services, including: the Meter Socket Adapter (MSA) Surge Suppressor, the Home Surge Protection Center (HSPC) Surge Suppressor, the Inside Outlet Surge Suppressor, and the Uninterruptible Power Supply (UPS). Termination of the Schedule 730 program will be effective January 1 2016.

Prior to the effective date of this filing, PGE will provide written notification to the thirty-three (33) enrolled customers about the MSA program's termination on December 31, 2015. Customers will have the option to either: keep the device and accept all liability as the new owner of the surge suppressor device, or to have PGE remove the surge suppressor device at no cost. PGE will remove the MSA device between January 1, 2016 and January 31, 2016. If PGE does not receive a customer's preferred option, the customer will be deemed to have elected to keep the device, with full knowledge that the device is no longer supported by PGE, and further accepted all liability for any risks associated with the failure or malfunction of the unit or device.

Additionally, this filing revises the Table of Contents to reflect the withdrawal of the Schedule.
