I. INTRODUCTION

The Industrial Customers of Northwest Utilities ("ICNU") submits these comments to the Public Utility Commission of Oregon ("OPUC" or the "Commission") regarding Commission Staff's ("Staff") Solar Photovoltaic Program Draft Report in Docket No. UM 1505 ("Draft Report"), released on November 21, 2012. The solar photovoltaic pilot program ("Pilot Program") was established pursuant to House Bill ("HB") 3039, and modified in 2010 by HB 3690. Under to ORS § 757.365(13), the Commission is required to submit a report to the legislature regarding the costs and effectiveness of the pilot program every two years. The Commission must file its next report no later than January 1, 2013.

II. COMMENTS

ICNU recommends that Staff revise the Draft Report to include a more substantive discussion of the retail rate impacts of the program. Pursuant to ORS § 757.365(13), the Draft Report must "evaluate the estimated cost of the program to retail electricity consumers." As written, the Draft Report devotes less than a page to discussion of "Program

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Costs and Estimated Rate Impacts." Draft Report at 14–15. For more detailed information, Staff

references the utilities' Rate Impact Reports contained in Attachment A. Id.

ICNU is concerned that this may be insufficient to satisfy the statutory reporting

requirement in to Oregon Revised Statute section 757.365(13). Without taking a position on the

technical sufficiency of the data contained in Attachment A, ICNU recommends that Staff

summarize the relevant information into an analysis for the body of the report. At a minimum,

ICNU requests that Staff should provide a breakdown of the table presented on page 15 of the

Draft Report and present the estimated costs to retail consumers in a fashion that will be more

readily useful to the legislature. The Report should also detail how the Pilot Program expenses

are allocated between the costs of incentive payments and administrative costs. Id. at 14. This

would allow the legislature to better understand how incentive dollars are spent under the

program. ICNU believes that it would also be appropriate to identify, by rate schedule, where

both the costs and the benefits of the program fall, in order to provide transparency for all

interested parties and the legislature.

While these discussions need not be extensive, further evaluation by Staff will

strengthen the interpretive value of the Draft Report for the Legislature.

III. CONCLUSION

ICNU appreciates the opportunity to submit these comments and recommends

that additional analysis be provided to ensure that the report conforms with the intent of the

legislature and provides more helpful and comprehensive information.
