7	Investigation into the Treatment of New Facility Direct Access Load

9	Pursuant to OAR 860-001-0420(4), Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Oregon		
10	(Staff) hereby responds to Oregon Citizens' Utility Board's ("CUB") Motion to Amend the		
11	Procedural Schedule in this proceeding.		
12	On October 18, 2017, CUB filed its Motion requesting that the Commission amend the		
13	current schedule to add a Commission determination on its legal authority to eliminate transition		
14	adjustments for commercial customers that are new to the utility's system. CUB did not specify		
15	a date for Commission determination in its Motion, and has not requested that the Commission		
16	suspend the current schedule while considering its legal authority.		
17	Staff takes no position on CUB's request that the Commission make a determination		
18	regarding its legal authority on the timeline that it deems appropriate in this proceeding.		
19	However, Staff clarifies two points raised in CUB's Motion. CUB asserts that the purpose of the		
20	comments portion of this proceeding is to discuss "how the Commission will eliminate transition		
21	adjustments for some customers." However, the intention behind the briefing portion of this		
22	proceeding was to address the legal parameters on the Commission's ability to consider different		
23	transition charges for new direct access load at a new site, but was not intended to assume that		
24	the secondary policy question—whether the Commission should exercise its authority—was		
25	assumed to be "yes" if the Commission finds it has the legal authority. As such, the comments

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1	portion of this proceeding is intended to include a discussion of whether the Commission should	
2	exercise its legal authority.	
3	Next, although some parties have characterized this proceeding to address the elimination	
4	of transition charges or credits, the Commission's direction did not assume that this docket	
5	would only address the complete elimination of transition charges. Staff's proposed	
6	Commission motion was "Open an investigation pursuant to ORS 756.515 to investigate	
7	questions related to the appropriate treatment of direct access transition adjustments for new	
8	commercial load at a new site," and Staff explained at the public meeting that the intent was to	
9	address whether "different" transition charges may be warranted. ³ The Commission adopted	
10	Staff's proposed motion with only one change to remove the word "commercial." Therefore,	
.11	while the elimination of transition charges is possible under the scope provided by the	
12	Commission, it is not assumed.
