This rulemaking adopts the latest edition of the National Electrical Safety Code (NESC). PUC's adoption by rule amendment of the latest NESC edition requires subject operators to stay up to date with current national standards and practices used in the construction, operation, and maintenance of electric supply lines and communication lines.

On the last day of the comment period, January 23, 2017, Idaho Power Company filed comments in support of the rule amendment. No other written comments were received.

DISPOSITION: RULE CHANGES ADOPTED

I. INTRODUCTION

We opened this rulemaking to adopt the 2017 Edition of the National Electrical Safety Code (NESC) in our rules. Every five years, the NESC is revised by a volunteer group of industry experts with the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE) acting as the secretariat, and then is approved by the American National Standards Institute. The 2017 NESC has an effective date of February 1, 2017.

II. PROCEDURAL HISTORY

On December 8, 2016, we filed a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking and Statement of Need and Fiscal Impact for this rulemaking with the Secretary of State, and we provided notice to all interested persons on the service lists established under OAR 860-001-0030(1)(b) and to legislators specified in ORS 183.335(1)(d). Notice of the rulemaking was published in the January 2017 *Oregon Bulletin*. The notice established a comment due date of January 23, 2017. Idaho Power Company submitted brief written comments supporting the adoption of the 2017 NESC. No other written comments were filed.

III. PROPOSED RULEMAKING

This rulemaking adopts the 2017 Edition of the NESC. Adoption by rule of this current version of the NESC requires subject operators to stay up to date with current national standards and practices used in the construction, operation and maintenance of electric supply lines and communication lines.

IV. ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. The rule changes to OAR 860-024-0010 are adopted as set forth in Appendix A to this order.
- 2. The rule changes will be effective upon filing with the Secretary of State.
