I, Stanton Sittser, being first duly sworn on oath, depose and say:

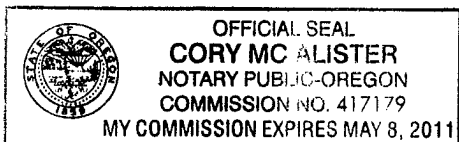
1. My full name is Stanton K. Sittser. I am the Customer Communications Supervisor with Portland General Electric ("PGE").

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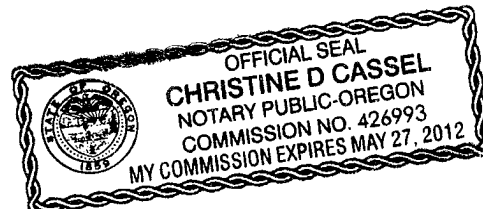

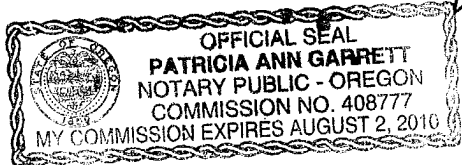

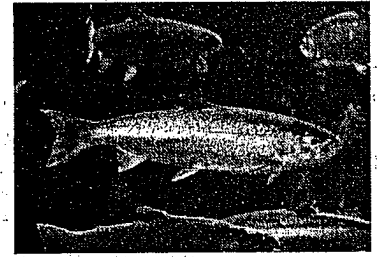

# Announcing a **hydro improvement project** to enhance water quality and fish passage.

Portland General Electric is providing the electricity you need while being a good steward of Oregon's environment. In order to meet Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) licensing requirements, PGE is partnering with the Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs to build an underwater tower and fish collection facility. This project is designed to help restore salmon and steelhead passage from the upper Deschutes, Metolius, and Crooked rivers in stable waters. The Selective Water Withdrawal Project (SWW Project) – located at Pelton Round Butte Dam near Lake Billy Chinook – will allow PGE to continue to make this low-cost power supply resource available. ## What's the bottom line for PGE customers?

A proposed electricity price increase is for the cost of PGE's portion of the SWW Project. On Oct. 24, 2008, PGE filed a request with the Oregon Public Utility Commission (OPUC) to increase rates 0.8 percent or \$12.9 million annually beginning in May 2009. The price changes for the majority of customer types (which include supplemental adjustments) would be:

Customer type	Average increase
Residential Customers (Schedule 7)	0.7%
Business Customers (Schedule 32)	0.7%
Commercial and Industrial (Schedules 83)	0.9%
Commercial and Industrial (Schedules 89)	1.0%

A typical PGE residential customer using 900 kilowatt-hours per month would see an increase of \$0.65 in their monthly bill. The actual price change may vary from the request based on the outcome of the public process.

It is conducted by the OPUC and includes involvement from customer groups, local governments and others. You are welcome to join the process by sharing your thoughts at public meetings hosted by the OPUC.
