The Citizens' Utility Board of Oregon (CUB) requests a collective grant of \$14,780 from the Northwest Natural, Avista and Cascade Natural Gas Issue Funds. CUB proposes this grant budget be broken down in the following manner: \$7,390 from the Northwest Natural Issues Fund; \$3,695 from the Avista Issues Fund and \$3,695 from the Cascade Natural Gas Issues Fund. CUB staff will keep track of their participation by hours and activity.

CUB is precertified as per OAR 860-001-0120(3)(a). UM 1565 is an eligible proceeding under the First Amended and Restated Intervenor Funding Agreement (Order No. 07-564, entered December 19, 2007) as approved by the Oregon Public Utility Commission. The proceeding directly affects Northwest Natural, Avista and Cascade Natural Gas, which are participating public utilities under the IFA. *See* Order No. 07-564 at Article 1(k). CUB filed its Revised Notice of Intent to Request an Issue Fund Grant on January 25, 2012, as required by the IFAs. *See* Order No. 07-564, Article 6.2; Order No. 10-396, Article 6.2.

Pursuant to paragraph 6.3 of the IFA, the proposed budget must identify certain points of information. We provide the information below.

<sup>1</sup> In its original filing of the Notice of Intent to Request an Issue Fund Grant, CUB mistakenly identified PacifiCorp, PGE and Idaho Power as the utilities from which CUB would be seeking an issue fund grant, rather than Northwest Natural, Avista and Cascade Natural Gas. This was an error on CUB's part that CUB has attempted to correct through its Motion to Admit CUB's Revised Intent to Request an Issue Fund Grant and CUB's Revised Notice of Intent to Request an Issue Fund Grant. Both were filed with the Commission on January 25, 2012. CUB apologizes for this error.

- (a) Statement of Work to Be Performed: CUB intends to participate in every procedural aspect of this case. We participated in the first pre-hearing conference and will participate in the second one as well. We will attend, in person or by phone, and participate in all or most workshops and any settlement meetings, hearings, and Commission presentations as appropriate. Following the filing of the formal schedule in this docket CUB will review and analyze any comments or testimony and any briefs filed by other parties. We will pursue discovery through data requests, and will respond to data requests asked of us as appropriate. We will file comments, testimony, and briefs, and present our recommendations to the Commission, including any proposed modifications or conditions as appropriate.
- (b) Description of Areas to Be Investigated: CUB intends to investigate issues relating to the Draft Straw Proposal including, but not limited to:
  - A. Whether fuel switching is cost-effective primarily for gas customers;
  - B. Whether there should be programs to incentivize customers to switch fuels; and
  - C. Issues raised by other parties to the proceeding.
- (c) Description of the Class or Classes Benefiting From CUB's Participation:CUB represents the interests of Northwest Natural's, Avista's and Cascade NaturalGas's residential customers in Oregon.
- (d) The Fund from Which CUB Seeks an Issue Fund Grant & Available Funds: CUB is seeking a collective issue fund grant of \$14,780 from the Northwest Natural, Avista and Cascade Natural Gas Issue Funds. Specifically, CUB proposes this grant budget be broken down in the following manner: \$7,390 from the Northwest Natural Issues Fund; \$3,695 from the Avista Issues Fund and \$3,695 from the Cascade Natural Gas Issues Fund. CUB's proposed budget of \$14,780 would leave roughly \$90,610 uncommitted in the Northwest Natural Issue Fund, \$56,305 uncommitted in the Avista Issue Fund and \$56,305 uncommitted in the Cascade Natural Gas Issue Fund.
- (e) The Budget Showing Estimated Fees and Costs: CUB's budget accompanies this document as Attachment A.

(f) A Representation of the Use of Matching Funds: The budget and an accounting for the use of matching funds accompany this document as Attachment A.
