ALJ Spruce,

On behalf of Lumen, please allow me to make a couple of related comments. Technically, the Commission did not *suspend* the Price Plan in Order 22-340; rather, it *extended* the existing Price Plan by a period not to exceed nine months. This is unlike a situation where the Commission suspends proposed rates under ORS 759.185 and is prohibited by that statute from having the suspension last more than nine months. Thus, it is Lumen's position that the Commission is not constrained by statute from further extending the Price Plan to allow the parties additional time to negotiate a settlement and, failing that, to proceed to a hearing. We also understand that the Commission would likely need to do so by order, which we believe is justified for the reasons set forth by Ms. Smith below.
