Pursuant to OAR 860-001-0120 and the Third Amended and Restated Intervenor Funding	
Agreement (IFA), approved in Order No. 15-335 (Oct. 20, 2015), the Oregon Citizens' Utility	
Board (CUB) and the Northwest Industrial Gas Users (NWIGU) hereby request that the Public	
Utility Commission of Oregon (the Commission) allow the filing of an Intervenor Funding Grant	
and Budget in the above captioned docket.	
UM 1654 was opened on May 13, 2013 to consider whether, at the time, the current	

sharing arrangement for NW Natural Gas Company's (NW Natural or the Company) interstate storage and optimization activities should be revised.¹ While the Commission held that the sharing arrangement in place at the time should be maintained, it ordered the Company to conduct a cost study to determine with greater clarity how costs are generated and shared.² In doing so, the Commission determined that a neutral third party should conduct an evaluation and cost allocation study of NW Natural's optimization activities, the assets being utilized for those

1 activities, the allocation between regulated and unregulated services, and the various components

of NW Natural's system that drive the costs and revenues associated with interstate storage

services.³ The Commission directed the UM 1654 parties to form a steering committee to

develop the third party contract, develop and articulate the elements of the study, interview and

hire the third party, and oversee the contractor's work.⁴

At this time, the members of the steering committee—comprised of Commission Staff,

CUB, NWIGU, and NW Natural—have collaborated to select a third party contractor to conduct

the work contemplated in Order No. 15-066. The steering committee selected the Liberty

Consulting Group of Lebanon, Pennsylvania to perform the work, and has begun preliminary

orientation, scoping, chronology, and data collection for the ongoing project.

CUB and NWIGU appreciate the fact that ongoing work subsequent to a final

Commission order renders the procedural status and timing of this motion to be somewhat

atypical. Given that there has been no prehearing conference, and the current work is an

extension of an existing docket, CUB and NWIGU have not had an opportunity to either set

deadlines for Intervenor Funding Grants or Budgets or outline other procedural aspects of

intervenor funding in this phase of the proceeding. CUB and NWIGU respectfully request

permission to file intervenor funding budgets outside of the typical time period contemplated in

the IFA. Since the subsequent work to be conducted arises directly out of UM 1654 and Order

No. 15-066, CUB and NWIGU ask that the Commission allow each individual organization to

separately file Intervenor Funding Grant and Budget requests to cover the extended activities in
