Investigation to Explore Issues Related to a Renewable Generator's Contribution to Capacity. PACIFICORP'S MOTION FOR GENERAL PROTECTIVE ORDER

1 Under ORCP 36(C)(7) and OAR 860-001-0080(1), PacifiCorp d/b/a Pacific Power 2 (PacifiCorp or Company) moves the Public Utility Commission of Oregon (Commission) for 3 entry of a standard protective order in this proceeding. 4 The Commission's rules authorize PacifiCorp to seek reasonable restrictions on discovery of trade secrets and other confidential business information. The Commission's 5 6 standard protective order is designed to allow the broadest possible discovery consistent with the need to protect confidential information.<sup>2</sup> PacifiCorp requests this protective order to 7 8 facilitate the communication of information between the parties and expedite the discovery 9 process. 10 It is expected that certain information in this proceeding will contain confidential 11 information, including but not limited to commercially sensitive load and resource 12 projections, confidential market analyses and business projections, and confidential 13 information regarding contracts for the purchase or sale of electric power. Furthermore, it is

- substantially likely that the staff and other parties to this proceeding will seek to discover
- 2 confidential business information. Public disclosure of the confidential information could be
- 3 detrimental to the Company and its respective customers. Accordingly, good cause exists to
- 4 issue a protective order to protect commercially sensitive and confidential business
- 5 information.
- For these reasons, PacifiCorp respectfully requests that the Commission enter its
- 7 standard protective order in this docket.
