RE: Avoided Cost Filing

The Hood River Electric Cooperative currently purchases all wholesale power required to serve our membership from the Bonneville Power Administration.

HREC signed a 20-year 'Regional Dialog' contract with BPA committing to remain a 'load following' customer of BPA for at least the next 14 years. Under the contract, BPA allocates the output of the Federal Columbia River Power System to its preference customers and sells it at the cost of production (including fish and wildlife mitigation costs, benefits to IOU customers, etc.). It is my understanding the allocation is based on actual utility loads for the 2010 BPA operating year. If a customer's load exceeds the allocation, the utility must acquire sufficient resources from BPA or another source – at a higher cost -- to cover utility load. Current BPA load forecasts suggest HREC's load growth can be served via BPA's Load Shaping Charge for several years into the future. BPA forecasts that HREC will pay a Load Shaping Charge in some months and receive a Load Shaping Credit in others. The Load Shaping Charge for the next BPA rate period is not established at this time but early indications suggest it will be in the range from \$23.72 to \$35.31 per MWH in 'High Load Hours' and from \$10.60 to \$30.13 per MWH in 'Light Load Hours'. If the Cooperative were to purchase Tier 2 power from BPA, though not anticipated in the next few years, it would be under their 'Load Growth' rate at \$45.32 \$/MWH. These figures represent our best estimate of 'Avoided Costs' at this time. BPA's rates are published on their web site at www.bpa.gov.
