9	I. <u>INTRODUCTION</u>		
10	Pursuant to ORS 757.259 and OAR 860-027-0300, Idaho Power Company ("Idaho		
11	Power") hereby requests an accounting order reauthorizing Idaho Power to defer for late		
12	ratemaking treatment the necessary incremental costs associated with participation in the		
13	western Energy Imbalance Market ("EIM") pursuant to Order No. 17-215. Idaho Power		
14	seeks authorization for this deferral effective as of the date of this Application. In support o		
15	this Application, Idaho Power states:		
16	1. Idaho Power is a public utility in the state of Oregon and its rates, services		
17	and accounting practices are subject to the regulation of the Public Utility Commission of		
18	Oregon ("Commission").		
19	2. This Application is filed pursu	ant to ORS 757.259, which allows the	
20	Commission, upon application, to authorize the	deferral of certain items for later inclusion in	
21	rates.

# II. OAR 860-027-0300(3) REQUIREMENTS

# 2 A. Description.

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With this deferral application, Idaho Power seeks authorization from the Commission

4 to accrue, for future amortization, (1) the necessary incremental start-up operations and

5 maintenance ("O&M") costs associated with participation in the western EIM and (2) if

6 ordered excluded from net power supply expenses in Docket No. UE 333,1 non-capital

incremental EIM-related O&M costs incurred after commencement of participation in the

8 western EIM.

### 9 B. Reasons for Deferral.

10 In Order No. 17-215, the Commission authorized the deferral of O&M-related costs

11 associated with Idaho Power's entrance into the western EIM. This deferral is intended to

12 capture the incremental costs related to participation in the western EIM in order to allow

13 the Company to match the benefits customers receive with the costs the Company incurs

14 and is filed pursuant to Order No. 17-215 and ORS 757.259(2)(e).

### 15 C. Proposed Accounting.

16 Idaho Power records expenses that would be subject to the deferral order in

17 accordance with the Code of Federal Regulations to the applicable Federal Energy

18 Regulatory Commission ("FERC") O&M accounts. Upon receiving authorization of a

19 deferral, Idaho Power proposes to record the deferred amounts by debiting FERC Account

20 182.3 (Regulatory Assets) and crediting the same O&M accounts.

# 21 D. <u>Estimate of Amounts</u>.

Through February 28, 2018, the Company has deferred approximately \$31,000 (on

23 an Oregon-jurisdictional basis) under Order No. 17-215. The Company anticipates

24 incurring approximately \$42,000 (on an Oregon-jurisdictional basis) of additional start-up

1	expenses. The Company's estimate of annual ongoing O&M is approximately \$85,000 on
2	an Oregon-jurisdictional basis, commencing with its April 2018 participation in the EIM.
3	Idaho Power requests that, in accordance with Order No. 05-1070, it be allowed to accrue
4	interest on the unamortized balance at a rate equal to its authorized weighted average cost
5	of capital most recently approved by the Commission.
6	E. <u>Notice</u> .
7	A copy of the Notice of Application for Deferred Accounting of Costs Associated with
8	Participation in an Energy Imbalance Market and a list of persons served with the Notice
9	are attached to the Application as Attachment A.
10	III. OAR 860-027-0300(4) REQUIREMENTS
11	A. <u>Entries in the Deferred Account to Date</u> .
12	Attached to the Application as Attachment B is a description and explanation of the
13	entries in this deferred account through February 28, 2018.
14	B. Reason for Continuation of Deferred Accounting.
15	As discussed in detail above, this deferral is intended to capture the incremental
16	costs associated with participation in an energy imbalance market to allow the Company to
17	match the benefits customers receive with the costs the Company incurs and is authorized
18	pursuant to Order No. 17-215.
19	IV. CONCLUSION
20	Deferred accounting treatment is an appropriate, just, and reasonable means of
21	implementing Order No. 17-215.
22	For the reasons stated above, Idaho Power requests permission to defer incremental
23	O&M costs associated with participation in an energy imbalance market effective the date
24	of this Application, pursuant to Order No. 17-215.
