SUBJECT: Qwest Corporation, Transmittal No. 2014-006-PL
Changes the USOCs associated with the Metro Optical Ethernet (MOE) 1Mbps Bandwidth Profile.

I have reviewed this filing and recommend that an acknowledgement letter be sent. The filing would go into effect December 9, 2014, and was received on December 8, 2014. The purpose of this filing by Qwest Corporation d/b/a CenturyLink QC (Qwest) is to change the USOCs associated with the Metro Optical Ethernet (MOE) 1Mbps Bandwidth Profile.

Universal Service Order Codes or USOCs, also referred to as Uniform Service Order Codes and Field Identifiers (FIDs), define various network components, interfaces, products and/or services. USOCs and FIDs will allow requests for products/services from Qwest in the most efficient manner and are used to clearly identify each billable service, to automate billing and for provisioning.

MOE is a flexible, "easy-to-use" transport service that uses established Ethernet transport technology. MOE allows customers to connect multiple enterprise locations within a service area using Ethernet protocol. MOE supports transmission speeds ranging from 5 Mbps (Megabits per second) to 1 Gbps (Gigabits per second) in increments of 10 Mbps (between 10 to 100 Mbps) and in increments of 100 Mbps (between 100 to 1,000 Mbps/1 Gbps).

This filing does not change other conditions of service, the terms, the rates, nor cause the withdrawal of any service.

Metro Optical Ethernet is classified in the *Other Services* group and is price listed pursuant Qwest's Price Plan. This filing is timely pursuant to Section P of the Price Plan, which, in pertinent part, says that the company: "...will make price list changes for New Services, Other Services, and Packages and Bundles at least one day prior to the effective date."
