STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the Public Utility Commission of Oregon (Commission) approve Portland General Electric's (PGE or Company) request for a partial waiver of OAR 860-021-0130(2) for a period of 60 days, effective on and after May 20, 2020.

DISCUSSION:

<u>Issue</u>

Whether the Commission should approve PGE's request for a partial waiver of OAR 860-860-021-0130(2), which concerns a customer's ability to be present at a meter test.

Applicable Rule or Law

Under OAR 860-021-0005, the Commission may waive any of the Division 21 rules upon a showing of good cause.

OAR 860-021-0130(2) relates to meter tests, specifying, "A customer and/or a designated representative shall have the right to be present at any meter test. The test shall be conducted at a mutually acceptable time during regular business hours."

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<u>Analysis</u>

Background

On April 1, 2020, PGE filed this application requesting a partial waiver of OAR 860-021-0130(2) due to the COVID-19 public health emergency. The Company requests a waiver of the first sentence of this rule effective immediately, for an initial period of 60 days. OAR 860-021-0130(2) relates to meter tests, specifying in part that, "A customer and/or a designated representative shall have the right to be present at any meter test."

The Company seeks this flexibility in order to protect customers and employees from potential exposure to COVID-19, noting that Executive Order No. 20-12 requires social distancing measures. The Company requests this waiver be in effect for an initial period of 60 days. The Company will monitor the situation and continually assess the need to seek any continuance of the waiver. The Company represents that it will continue to pull and test meters as needed, and will send the customer the results of any meter tests, including those that the customer would have otherwise been permitted to witness.

Conclusion

Staff reviewed the Company's filing and finds there is good cause to support the waiver request due to the current need for social distancing, and the limited value to the customer in witnessing a meter test from a distance. Given the uncertainties and flux with the public health situation, as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, immediate action for a period of 60 days is appropriate.

PROPOSED COMMISSION MOTION:

Approve PGE's partial waiver request of OAR 860-021-0130(2) for a period of 60 days, effective on and after May 20, 2020.
