DISPOSITION: PROCEEDINGS SUSPENDED

Following consultation with the Commissioners, I suspend these proceedings to help coordinate the review of an item expected to be addressed in multiple dockets.

In its 2011 Integrated Resource Plan (IRP) update, Idaho Power identifies in its Near-Term Action Plan the installation of Selective Catalytic Reduction (SCR) technology at the company's generating facilities at the Jim Bridger Station. Idaho Power is a minority owner of Jim Bridger Station.

The acknowledgement of these SCR investments is expected to also be addressed in Pacific Power's upcoming 2013 IRP, which will be filed at the end of the month. Pacific Power is the majority owner and operator of Jim Bridger Station.

Due to the overlap of issues, the Commission has concluded that it would be more logical to review the planning for investments in Pacific Power's IRP prior to, or at least simultaneous with, Idaho Power's investments in the same upgrade at the same facilities. Timing these reviews so that Idaho Power's 2011 IRP Update does not precede Pacific Power's 2013 IRP will help the Commission reach more consistent and logical conclusions.

Accordingly, the proceedings in this docket are suspended pending the filing of Pacific Power's 2013 IRP.
