On May 13, 2014, counsel for Sierra Club sent a letter to the Commissioners, along with testimony filed by Sierra Club witness Dr. Jeremy Fisher earlier this month in the Utah Public Service Commission's general rate case of Pacific Power (dba Rocky Mountain Power). In the letter, Sierra Club noted Pacific Power's opposition to Sierra Club's sending the Commissioners Dr. Fisher's Utah testimony, but stated it is nevertheless sending the testimony because it directly relates to pertinent issues that have arisen in this docket.

On May 15, 2014, I received a phone call from Sarah Wallace, counsel for Pacific Power, advising me of Pacific Power's intent to object to Sierra Club's letter and attached Utah testimony, and asking what steps Pacific Power should take to notify the Commissioners of its opposition.

With the agreement of the Commissioners and in the interest of administrative efficiency, Sierra Club's letter and attached testimony have been passed to Commission Staff for review. Staff will determine if the Utah testimony contains new information that is relevant to Pacific Power's IRP, and, if so, will present the information in this docket. If Staff presents the information, Pacific Power and other parties will be given the opportunity to respond as necessary. The letter and testimony will not be reviewed by the Commissioners or filed in this docket at this time.
