PREHEARING CONFERENCE MEMOR ANDUM

On January 21, 2011, the Public Utility Commission of Oregon (Commission) held a prehearing conference in this docket. Representatives appeared in person on behalf of the Public Utility Commission of Oregon Staff, Portland General Electric Company, Idaho Power Company, and the Oregon Department of Energy. Representatives appeared via telephone on behalf of Citizens' Utility Board of Oregon, Community Renewable Energy Association, PacifiCorp, dba. Pacific Power, and the Industrial Customers of Northwest Utilities.

Following an off-the record discussion, the parties proposed the following schedule, which I adopted:

The parties' comments should be crafted using the issues identified in Order No. 10-488, Appendix A. The Commission will set a further schedule in this docket as appropriate.

The schedule includes a requested date for petitions to intervene. By statute, a person may petition to intervene at any time before the close of the record.<sup>2</sup> But because it is helpful if parties are identified early in the proceedings, the Commission requests that petitions to intervene be filed by the date identified above.
