RULE SUMMARY

This rulemaking implements the Senate Bill 286 changes to ORS 757.991 effective, June 2, 2015. The changes increase the amount of maximum civil penalties for gas storage and pipeline safety violations to comport with the Federal standards, and allow the PUC to directly assess and collect the penalty. The maximum civil penalty is increased from \$10,000 to \$200,000 per event per day and the maximum penalty for a series of failures is raised from \$500,000 to \$2,000,000.

The Commission encourages participants to file written comments as early as practicable in the proceedings so that other participants have the opportunity to consider and respond to the comments before the deadline. A public rulemaking hearing may be requested in writing by 10 or more people, or by an association with 10 or more members, within 21 days following the publication of the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking in the Oregon Bulletin or 28 days from the date Notice was sent to people on the agency mailing list, whichever is later. If sufficient hearing requests are received, the notice of the date and time of the rulemaking hearing must be published in the Oregon Bulletin at least 14 days before the hearing.

The Agency requests public comment on whether other options should be considered for achieving the rule's substantive goals while reducing negative economic impact of the rule on business.

Need for the Rule(s):

The rule changes are needed to comport with Federal standards from the U.S. Department of Transportation's Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA). Adoption of the Federal standard is required for continued PHMSA certification allowing the PUC to enforce intrastate natural gas pipeline safety regulations.

Fiscal and Economic Impact:

Fiscal and economic impact are created by the changes to the law and not by these rules that implement the changes to the law.

Stakeholders subject to the rules will not be assessed increased penalties unless they are found in violation of the applicable laws. According to PUC Staff, only one operator was fined in the last five years.

Statement of Cost of Compliance:

1. Impact on state agencies, units of local government and the public (ORS 183.335(2)(b)(E)):

There is no change to cost of compliance. If the laws pertaining to hazardous substances are violated, then the operator may be assessed the increased penalties.

2. Cost of compliance effect on small business (ORS 183.336):

- a. Estimate the number of small business and types of businesses and industries with small businesses subject to the rule: Natural gas pipeline operators are subject to these rule changes. None of these are small businesses.
 - b. Projected reporting, recordkeeping and other administrative activities required for compliance, including costs of professional services:

There are no additional reporting, recordkeeping, or other administrative activities required for compliance to the changes.

c. Equipment, supplies, labor and increased administration required for compliance:

No additional equipment, supplies, labor or administration is required for compliance to the changes.

How were small businesses involved in the development of this rule?

Stakeholders were notified in November 2013 of the PUC's intent to introduce the legislation resulting in these changes and had the opportunity to participate in the legislative process.

Administrative Rule Advisory Committee consulted?:No If not, why?:

These rule changes implement the changes to the law.

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Civil Penalties

(1) Civil penalties for failure to comply with gas pipeline safety rules or regulations **shall beare** based on the gravity of the violation, the extent of the operators' past violations, and other matters as justice may require.

(2) NOTE: **ORS** 756.180 provides for the enjoining of a violation of the utility laws. ORS 757.991 provides for penalties for failure to comply with gas pipeline safety rules or regulations of \$10,000200,000 per day, to a maximum of \$500,0002,000,000 for any related series of failures.
