("Eagle") regarding a proposed rate increase, which is scheduled to be effective June 1, 2017. This filing increases the residential rate from \$16.60 per month to \$18.50. Eagle is exempt from filing tariffs. The copy of the customer notice is provided pursuant to statute and Commission rule.

The Federal Communications Commission has issued an Order (FCC Order No. 11-161) that requires the Company to increase its rates to the levels set forth in the enclosed notice or face a corresponding reduction in its universal service support.

There is a chance that the FCC will reverse its position. If it happens, the rate will revert to \$16.60 as quickly as possible.

Important Notice about Your Telephone Rates

Effective June 1, 2017, Eagle Telephone System, Inc. will be increasing the One-Party Residential service rate from \$16.60 to \$18.50 per month. The rate change is in response to regulatory reforms issued by the Federal Communications Commission including reduction in inter-carrier compensation.
