## DISPOSITION: TARIFF SHEETS FURTHER SUSPENDED

In separate filings, Portland General Electric Company (PGE) and Northwest Natural (NW Natural) submitted tariff sheets designed to decouple their respective companies' revenues from sales. The Commission suspended both filings for investigation pursuant to ORS 757.210 and ORS 757.215. *See* Order Nos. 01-750 and 01-751. The current six-month suspension period for both filings expires March 31, 2002.

The Commission recently concluded to hold both dockets in abeyance pending its review of NW Natural's proposed purchase of PGE (UM 1045). Accordingly, the Commission finds that its investigation in these cases will not be completed by the expiration of the initial suspension period. Therefore, both filings should be further suspended for an additional period not more than three-months from the end of the initial suspension period. *See* ORS 757.215(1).

## **ORDER**

IT IS ORDERED that Advice No. 01-3, filed by Portland General Electric Company, and Advice No. 01-10, filed by Northwest Natural, are suspended for an additional three-month period through June 30, 2002.
