#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Grant Qwest's request to open ten sequential thousands blocks of telephone numbers in the 971 NPA that begin with 971-NX3 for the State of Oregon.

### **DISCUSSION:**

The State of Oregon is making this request of Qwest as a result of the legacy Portland configuration and growth needs. The current number plan does not lend itself to a uniform dialing plan for the State. In addition, the State has insufficient number blocks to implement a plan for expanded use of DID by State agencies.

Qwest submitted a request to Neustar, the national numbering administrator, to meet the States' numbering requirements in the new 971 overlay area code. That request was denied as Qwest did not meet the months-to-exhaust threshold (MTE). The Portland rate center is currently at 184 MTE and 74% utilization. The FCC requires that a rate center be at 65% or more utilization and is at 6 months or less to exhaust before significant numbering resources can be allocated.

In its Third Report and Order on Numbering Resource Optimization (FCC Docket No. 99-200, Order No. 01-362), the FCC allowed for a waiver of the rules by a State Commission when there is a demonstrated need for a large block of numbers.
