DISPOSITION: CANCELLATION ORDER RESCINDED

On October 5, 1994, the Commission granted a certificate of authority to Touch 1 Communications Inc. (Touch 1) to provide telecommunications service in Oregon as a competitive provider. *See* Order No. 94-1504. Oregon telecommunications providers are required to provide requested information to the Commission. After investigation, the Commission found that Touch 1 failed to respond to requests for information sent to it by the Commission on August 25, 2004, as required by OAR 860-032-0008(2). At the November 9, 2004, public meeting, the Commission determined that Touch 1's certificate of authority should be canceled. Touch 1's certificate of authority was canceled in Order No. 04-687.

On December 15, 2004, Touch 1 filed a request to suspend Order No. 04-687, claiming that it had complied with the Commission's rules and regulations. A review of the Commission's records indicates that Touch 1 filed the requested information.

The information sent by Touch 1 to the Commission was late. However, the information has been received and it indicates Touch 1 is providing telecommunications service in Oregon. Under the circumstances, the cancellation of Touch 1's certificate should be rescinded.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that Order No. 04-687 canceling the certificate of authority of Touch 1 Communications Inc., is rescinded.
