DISPOSITION: PETITION FOR SECOND EXTENSION GRANTED IN PART

In Order No. 06-642, the Public Utility Commission of Oregon (Commission) asserted jurisdiction over Crooked River Ranch Water Company (CRRWC) and directed the company to file tariffs within 60 days. Subsequently, in Order No. 07-022, the Commission granted CRRWC an extension of time to file those tariffs. CRRWC now seeks a second extension of time because: (1) a meeting with the Commission staff was delayed due to inclement weather; (2) its accountant's time is limited due to tax filing season; (3) CRRWC's president is out of town; and (4) the general manager is dealing with unrelated legal issues.

Staff opposes CRRWC's request for a further extension of time. Staff contends that further delay may harm customers, who have repeatedly voiced concerns about surcharges contained in CRRWC's rates. Staff also argues that CRRWC has failed to establish good cause for an additional extension. Specifically, Staff notes that the delayed meeting cited by CRRWC was not related to the filing of tariffs; that CRRWC's initial delay caused the conflict with the tax filing season; and that CRRWC has failed to demonstrate how the president's travel schedule and the general manager's legal issues are relevant to the company's inability to comply with Order No. 06-642. Alternatively, Staff recommends that any additional extension be limited to 30 days.

Given the potential harm to customers, CRRWC's petition for an extension of time is granted in part. Orders No. 06-642 and 07-022 are modified to allow CRRWC a final extension of 30 days to file compliance tariffs.
