DISPOSITION: SUPPLEMENT TO ORDER NO. 07-337

In Order No. 07-337, issued on August 8, 2007, the Public Utility Commission of Oregon granted the Citizens' Utility Board of Oregon's request for payment of NW Natural's Issue Fund Grant. On page 2, that order included the following language in the first paragraph, "We have considered the intended beneficiaries, and find that the issue fund expenditures should be allocated to *PGE's* residential customers" (Emphasis added); and that order included the following language in the "ORDER" section:

2. NW Natural Gas Company shall pay \$6,157.75 from the NW Natural Issue Fund to the Citizens' Utility Board of Oregon within 30 days after receipt of this Order, and the grant shall be assessed to *PGE's* residential customers. (Emphasis added.)

The inclusion of the language "PGE" was in error. The Order should have read "...should be allocated to NW Natural's residential customers" and "...shall be assessed to NW Natural's residential customers." (Emphasis added). Accordingly, Order No. 07-337 is modified to remove any reference to the language cited above. The remainder of the order is unchanged.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that Order No. 07-337 is modified to delete the language "PGE" as set forth on page 2, and replaced with the language "NW Natural." The remainder of the order is unchanged.
