DISPOSITION: CHARGES ASSESSED

The Public Utility Commission of Oregon (Commission) has designated its files on the subject of this matter as the record in this case. Based on information contained in those files, the Commission makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

OREGONTEL LLC is a telecommunications provider required to submit quarterly contribution worksheets and payments to the Commission for the Oregon Universal Service Fund (OUSF). See ORS 759.425, and OAR 860-032-0620.

OREGONTEL LLC failed to submit the quarterly contribution payment(s) by the due date(s) as set out in OAR 860-032-0620(3).

The Commission sent a Proposed Order to OREGONTEL LLC on March 14, 2008. OREGONTEL LLC did not respond.

Pursuant to OAR 860-032-0620 and OAR 860-032-0630, the Commission has proposed OREGONTEL LLC owes \$2,703.47 which includes the contribution payment(s), late payment penalty(ies) and interest for the third quarter of 2007.

The interest amount is calculated as of the date of this order. The interest will continue to accrue at 9 percent per annum until the Commission receives full contribution payment. Conclusions

OREGONTEL LLC failed to provide quarterly contribution payments required by law. The amount set forth above should be assessed, with the exception that the interest will continue to accrue at 9 percent per annum until the Commission receives full contribution payment.

IT IS ORDERED that the above amounts are assessed against OREGONTEL LLC and are immediately due and payable to the Public Utility Commission, PO Box 2153, Salem, Oregon 97308-2153.
