DISPOSITION: CANCELLATION ORDER RESCINDED


On June 21, 2004, the Commission granted a certificate of authority to United American Technology Inc. (UAT) to provide telecommunications service in Oregon as a competitive provider. *See* Order No. 04-345. After investigation, the Commission found that UAT failed to submit the annual fee statement and payment by the due date of April 1, 2008. *See* OAR 860-032-0095. UAT submitted an annual fee statement and payment on April 11, 2008, but failed to submit a late payment penalty of 2 percent as required by ORS 756.310. On April 11, 2008, the Commission notified the certificate holder that the required fees were not received. In view of the foregoing, the Commission determined at its May 6, 2008, Public Meeting that the certificate holder had failed to comply with Commission rules and terms of the certificate. The certificate of authority to provide telecommunications service for UAT was cancelled, per OAR 860-032-0008(2). *See* Order No. 08-303.

On July 7, 2008, UAT filed a request to suspend Order No. 08-303, claiming that it had complied with the Commission's rules and regulations. A review of the Commission's records indicates that UAT paid the requested fees.

The fees submitted by UAT to the Commission were late. However, they have now been received and indicate UAT is providing telecommunications service in Oregon. Under the circumstances, the cancellation of UAT's certificate should be rescinded.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that Order No. 08-303 canceling the certificate of authority of United American Technology Inc., is rescinded.



A party may request rehearing or reconsideration of this order pursuant to ORS 756.561. A request for rehearing or reconsideration must be filed with the Commission within 60 days of the date of service of this order. The request must comply with the requirements in OAR 860-014-0095. A copy of any such request must also be served on each party to the proceeding as provided by OAR 860-013-0070(2). A party may appeal this order by filing a petition for review with the Court of Appeals in compliance with ORS 183.480-183.484.
