DISPOSITION: CANCELLATION ORDER RESCINDED

On June 11, 2008, the Commission granted a certificate of authority to Air Speed LLC (Air Speed) to provide telecommunications service in Oregon as a competitive provider. *See* Order No. 08-322. Oregon telecommunications providers are required to provide requested information to the Commission. After investigation, the Commission found that Air Speed failed to file an annual report for the year 2008 as required by OAR 860-032-0060(2)(a). On April 9, 2009, the Commission notified Air Speed that the report had not been received. At the June 16, 2009, public meeting, the Commission determined that Air Speed's certificate of authority should be canceled. Air Speed's certificate of authority was canceled in Order No. 09-238.

On August 24, 2009, Air Speed filed a request to suspend Order No. 09-238, claiming that it had complied with the Commission's rules and regulations. A review of the Commission's records indicates that Air Speed filed the requested information.

The information sent by Air Speed to the Commission was late. However, the information has been received and it indicates Air Speed is providing telecommunications service in Oregon. Under the circumstances, the cancellation of Air Speed's certificate should be rescinded.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that Order No. 09-238 canceling the certificate of authority of Air Speed LLC, is rescinded.
