MOTION GRANTED: ORDER NO. 14-318 CORRECTED

On October 9, 2014, Portland General Electric Company (PGE), the Citizens' Utility Board of Oregon, the Industrial Customers of Northwest Utilities, and the Staff of the Commission, filed a motion to correct Order No. 14-318. In that order, we adopted two stipulations and resolved all issues in this docket.

The parties note that, in the summary section to Order No. 14-318, we stated that the stipulations result in a \$24.7 million reduction to PGE's net variable power costs (NVPC). The parties explain this figure is incorrect, because the stipulation included other agreements that will impact PGE's NVPC, and that the total NVPC impact to these adjustments is expected to be significantly less than \$24.7 million. The parties add that the stipulation did not quantify the dollar impact of these adjustments because the ultimate effect will not be known until PGE makes its final MONET update filing

The motion is granted. The opening summary of Order No. 14-138 is corrected to remove the reference to a specific dollar amount, as shown below:

## I. SUMMARY

In this order, we adopt the stipulations of the parties regarding Portland General Electric Company's 2014 proposed Net Variable Power Costs (NVPC) and the Annual Power Cost Update (APCU) reducing the PGE NVPC rate request by approximately \$24.7 million and order PGE to file new tariffs reflecting the modifications and conditions set forth in the stipulations.

The remainder of Order No. 14-318 is unchanged.
