ORDER

DISPOSITION: TIME LINE SPECIFIED IN ORDER NO. 17-123 AMENDED

On September 22, 2020, and December, 11, 2020, Staff of the Public Utility Commission filed motions to admit an amended stipulation and to admit a second amended stipulation, respectively. Staff's motions explain that Order No. 17-123, which adopted a stipulation signed by Roats Water System, Staff, and other parties, requires the filing of a general rate case on or before September 29, 2020. Staff's motions, supported by Roats and intervenors, request that the deadline for filing a general rate case be extended ultimately to March 1, 2021, and request leave to amend the stipulation to that effect.

Order No. 17-123 incorporated the stipulation the motions seek to amend. Accordingly, to effectively change the deadline for the filing of the general rate case, the order itself must be amended.

The Chief Administrative Law Judge has been delegated the authority to modify time lines specified in a Commission order.¹ Exercising that authority, I find good cause to amend Order No. 17-123, to change the incorporated stipulation requiring the filing of a general rate case "no later than three years and six months after a final order is issued in this case, with a test year reflective of the Company's most recent full fiscal year of actuals" to "no later than March 1, 2021."
