DISPOSITION: MOTION GRANTED

On May 19, 2010, Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Oregon (Commission) filed a motion to extend the due date for submission of Staff's testimony on depreciation rate issues in the above captioned proceeding. The current due date for such testimony is May 26, 2010 (testimony on all issues is due that day). Staff requests the due date for its testimony on depreciation rate issues be moved to June 4, 2010.

Staff represents that all parties were notified of the motion prior to its submission. Although no party objects to the motion, Staff indicates that PacifiCorp, dba Pacific Power (Pacific Power), requested that discovery related to Staff's depreciation testimony be expedited even more (with turnaround required in five business days) and reserved the right to seek an extension of the same amount of time to reply to Staff's depreciation testimony.

Staff's motion, as qualified by Pacific Power, is granted. The procedural schedule is modified as follows:
