**SUBJECT:** Frontier Communications Northwest Inc., Advice No. 038SPL  
Deletes Business Rewards Program from the price list.

I have reviewed this filing and recommend that an acknowledgement letter be sent. The filing went into effect August 4, 2015, and was filed August 3, 2015. The company proposes to delete the Business Rewards Program from its price list. The company states that the program has no current subscribers.

Oregon Administrative Rule (OAR) 860-032-0020 (8) permits a telecommunications utility to abandon a regulated service for which there are no current customers by filing a tariff change which deletes the regulated service. The filing must clearly and explicitly disclose which regulated service the utility proposes to abandon.

The filing complies with Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) 759.175, which requires telecommunications utilities to submit tariff filings to the Commission whenever a telecommunications utility intends to change its rates, terms, or conditions of service. The Commission Order No. 14-347, in docket UM 1686, established a *Price Plan* for CenturyTel under ORS 759.255. This filing was submitted on August 3, 2015, and thus, complies with CenturyTel *Price Plan*, Section P, which requires price list changes to be filed at least one day prior to their effective dates

Business Rewards Program is an optional, account-level reward plan available to Frontier business customers. Customers enrolled in the plan are awarded plan points for total monthly qualified charges on their Frontier monthly bill. The points are redeemable for various company-sponsored redemption offers. There is no charge to enroll or withdraw from the plan.
