8	I. <u>INTRODUCTION</u>		
9	Pursuant to ORS 757.210, ORS 757.259, and OAR 860-027-0300, Idaho Power		
10	Company ("Idaho Power" or "Company") hereby requests an accounting order authorizing		
11	Idaho Power to defer decommissioning revenues collected and decommissioning costs		
12	incurred pursuant to Order No. 12-235 and Idaho Power Tariff Schedule 92. Schedule 92		
13	is an "automatic adjustment clause" as defined in ORS 757.210. Idaho Power seeks		
14	authorization for this deferral effective as of June 1, 2017. In support of this Application,		
15	Idaho Power states:

## II. OAR 860-027-0300(3) REQUIREMENTS

#### 2 A. Description

With this deferral application, Idaho Power seeks authorization from the Commission to defer, for future true-up, decommissioning revenues collected and decommissioning costs incurred, pursuant to Tariff Schedule 92, in accordance with Order No. 12-235.

## B. <u>Reasons for Deferral</u>

7 On September 26, 2011, Idaho Power filed an application with the Commission requesting approval of the establishment of Schedule 92, the balancing account whereby incremental costs and benefits associated with the early shutdown of the Boardman power 10 plant ("Boardman") will be tracked and recovered from Oregon customers (Docket No. UE 11 239). In June 2012, the Commission issued Order No. 12-235, approving the Company's 12 proposed balancing account and method for recovering costs associated with the shutdown 13 of Boardman. The approved balancing account tracks costs associated with (1) a return on undepreciated existing Boardman capital investments, (2) the accelerated depreciation of 14 15 existing Boardman investments and (3) decommissioning costs related to the Boardman 16 shutdown through Schedule 92, smoothing revenue requirement impacts of the early 17 Boardman retirement over the remaining years of the plant's life and allowing for full 18 recovery of Boardman-related costs by Boardman life end.

19 On May 12, 2017, Idaho Power filed revisions to Schedule 92, adding language indicating the Boardman Operating Life Adjustment is an automatic adjustment clause 20 21 ("AAC") to promote consistency among similar AACs. Likewise, the AAC requires Idaho 22 Power file a deferral request. This deferral is intended to provide for the deferral and 23 tracking of decommissioning revenues collected and decommissioning costs incurred until 24 decommissioning activities are concluded, and is filed pursuant to Order No. 12-235 and 25 ORS 757.259(2)(e). In addition, this deferral will match appropriately the costs borne by 26 and benefits received by customers.

#### C. Proposed Accounting

Idaho Power records revenues and expenses that would be subject to the deferral order in accordance with the Code of Federal Regulations to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission ("FERC") Accounts 440-444 (Operating Revenues), FERC Account 557 (Other Expenses), and FERC Accounts 500-598 (Operations and Maintenance Accounts). Upon receiving approval of a deferral, Idaho Power proposes to record the deferred amounts to FERC Account 254 (Regulatory Liabilities) until decommissioning activities are concluded. After decommissioning activities are concluded, amounts in the deferral account, either positive or negative, will be recovered or refunded in customer rates through a surcharge or credit, as appropriate.

#### D. Estimate of Amounts

12 Order No. 12-235 approved an Oregon jurisdictional revenue requirement increase of \$107,223 associated with the recovery of the annual incremental return on and accelerated depreciation of existing Boardman investments, and decommissioning costs related to the Boardman shutdown. On March 17, 2017, Idaho Power filed its annual 15 update of the incremental revenue requirement and review of the Boardman balancing 16 account for 2016, updating the decommissioning cost estimate based on a new 17 decommissioning estimate which decreased the annual incremental revenue requirement 18 to \$102,011. Idaho Power estimates the deferral account will contain the Oregon 19 jurisdictional share of decommissioning costs, approximately \$521,000, at December 31, 20 2020. Because deferred amounts associated with decommissioning costs are dependent 21 on factors that cannot be precisely forecasted, Idaho Power cannot provide a precise 22 estimate of the total deferred amount. 23
