

I am employed by Idaho Power Company 1. 15 as the Senior Manager of Revenue Requirement. 16 2. Idaho Power Company filed with the Public Utility Commission of Oregon its 17 Request for a rate revision on June 4, 2021. 18 3. Pursuant to OAR 860-022-0017, Idaho Power Company caused to be 19 published in the following newspapers of general circulation in the communities served by 20 Idaho Power Company (Argus Observer - Ontario, Oregon, Hells Canyon Journal -21 Halfway, Oregon, The Baker City Herald - Baker City, Oregon, and The Malheur 22 Enterprise – Vale, Oregon) a display advertisement announcing the rate revision. The ad 23 ran in each of the newspapers on Wednesday, June 16, 2021. The ad size in the Argus 24 Observer was 4.9 inches wide by 10 inches tall, 5.75 inches wide by 10 inches tall in the 25 Hells Canyon Journal, 5.25 inches wide by 10 inches tall in the Baker City Herald, and 4.9

inches wide by 10 inches tall in the Malheur Enterprise. It should be noted that for each

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1	ad, the Company requested a size of three columns wide by ten inches tall. Due to varying						
2	sizes of the publications themselves, the respective ad sizes vary. A copy of the display						
3	announcement is attached to this Affidavit as Exhibit A (actual size published is listed						
4	above).

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## Idaho Power has requested a rate adjustment with the Oregon Public Utility Commission (OPUC) related to depreciation of the company's assets.

If approved as filed, rates in Oregon would increase \$139,462 overall, and the average residential customer using 1,150 kilowatt hours (kWh) of energy per month would see a monthly bill increase of \$0.27, effective December 1, 2021.

Energy companies like Idaho Power recover the cost of their investments in assets over their expected lives through depreciation expense. Every five years, Idaho Power files a study with the OPUC analyzing the expected lives of its assets. Those findings result in changes to rates through adjusted cost recovery of these assets. The study was performed this year, and proposed impacts to each customer class are included in the table below.
