Re: In the Matter of South Coast Water Company, LLC Request for a General Rate Revision

To Whom It May Concern:

The customers of the South Coast Water Company, LLC (hereafter SCWS), reside within the boundaries of Dunes City city limits. The area is predominantly considered median income, with many of the residents being retired and living on fixed incomes or young families with young children, just starting out. While we understand the need for rate increases as the expenses of doing business continue to rise, the City would oppose an increase of this magnitude.

The letter sent to SCWC customers indicated the average monthly bill of \$47.54 would increase to \$121.02 as a result of the rates suggested in the petition. This calculates to a 255% increase. Such an increase would be a shock to the budget of any family and could be devastating to those on fixed incomes. We suggest a much lower, more reasonable rate be considered.

Our neighboring city to the north, Florence, has a monthly rate for water of \$29.00. Our neighboring city to the South, Reedsport, has a monthly rate for water of \$28.75. Neither city currently charges an additional per gallon

usage rate. The City supports a per gallon usage rate, as we believe it encourages conservation, but again, this usage rate should be reasonable.

Mr. Puttman's letter makes no mention in his Notice as to what that rate might be, or if it is proposed to be changed from the current rate. While it is true both cities have far more customers than currently served by SCWC, we are aware that Mr. Puttman desires to expand his boundaries to provide even more Dunes City residents with water service. We applaud, and even welcome, those efforts, however, we don't think the expansion of the water system, and the resulting increase of income for SCWC, should be paid for by its current customers. We believe it is the responsibility of the company to pay for any such expansion of the system or seek funding from outside sources and/or investors. Any increase sought by SCWC should be to operate and maintain the current system and not address any future expansion ideas.
