DISPOSITION: MOTION TO ADMIT COUNSEL PRO HAC VICE GRANTED

On May 2, 2024, the Oregon Citizens' Utility Board filed a motion to allow Claire Valentine-Fossum to appear as counsel *pro hac vice* in this proceeding.
