Pursuant to Oregon Revised Statute 757.205 and Oregon Administrative Rule (OAR) 860-022-0025, PacifiCorp d/b/a Pacific Power (PacifiCorp or the Company) submits for filing the following modified tariff pages relating to PacifiCorp’s Schedule 101 Municipal Exaction Adjustment (Schedule 101). PacifiCorp respectfully requests an effective date of July 1, 2024.

Purpose

The purpose of this filing is to remove the Dallas Municipal Exaction Adjustment from Schedule 101.

Background and Proposal

Schedule 101 is designed to collect exactions imposed on the Company by municipalities and billed separately by the Company to customers within the jurisdiction’s limits under OAR 860-22-0046. On December 6, 2004, the City of Dallas passed Ordinance 1649 and Resolution 3059 requiring PacifiCorp to remove overhead facilities and install underground facilities at the request of the city. On March 27, 2006, PacifiCorp filed Advice 06-009 requesting to implement a municipal exaction adjustment of 1.07% on Dallas customer bills to recover the cost of the undergrounding project. On April 13, 2006, the City of Dallas filed a letter supporting the Company’s filing, and on April 25, 2006, the Public Utility Commission of Oregon approved the Dallas Municipal Exaction Adjustment.

As approved, the Dallas Municipal Exaction Adjustment was designed to collect \$1,174,203 from Dallas customers over a period of 20 years. The balance has been reduced to approximately \$36,000 as of the end of March 2024 and PacifiCorp estimates the balance will be fully collected effective with usage through June 2024. The Company respectfully requests to cancel the Dallas Municipal Exaction Adjustment effective with service on and after July 1, 2024.

Tariff Changes and Impacts

OAR 860-022-0025 requires that PacifiCorp submit a statement of the tariff schedule change, the number of customers affected, the change in revenue, and the grounds supporting the change. PacifiCorp estimates that approximately 7,600 Dallas customers will be impacted by this

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proposed change. As the dollars collected through this adjustment have been applied against a separate account, this change will not result in a change to the Company's annual revenues. Dallas customers will see a decrease to their bills of approximately 1%.

Although the Dallas Municipal Exaction adjustment is currently the only adjustment on Schedule 101, the Company proposes to keep Schedule 101 in effect and available for use with similar projects in the future.

Purpose
