In the Matter of the Application of Qwest Corporation for an Order Unallocating and Transferring Rights To Allocated Territory to Pine Telephone Systems, Inc. and to Abandon such Territory APPLICATION OF QWEST CORPORATION FOR AN ORDER UNALLOCATING AND TRANSFERRING RIGHTS TO ALLOCATED TERRITORY TO PINE TELEPHONE SYSTEMS, INC. AND TO ABANDON SUCH TERRITORY

Pursuant to ORS 759.560 and OAR 860-025-0027, Qwest Corporation ("Qwest") hereby applies for an order unallocating and transferring rights to an allocated territory, commonly known as the "Three Rivers area," that is currently in Qwest's Culver Exchange, to Pine Telephone Systems, Inc. ("Pine"), as well as the authority to abandon such territory. Because Qwest seeks to unallocate and transfer such territory to Pine Telephone, and to abandon such territory, Qwest hereby also seeks approval of its revised Culver Exchange service area.

In support thereof, and pursuant to the requirements of OAR 860-025-0027,¹

Qwest states and submits the following information:

Statement of Purposes for the Transfer²

The purpose of this Application to transfer and abandonment of this territory is to permit Pine to provide telecommunications service to residents of an area locally known

as the Three Rivers area who require telecommunications service. According to Pine, which is concurrently filing an application for allocation of allocated territory for the requested transfer of territory from Qwest to Pine, the Three Rivers service area lays to the west of the Deschutes River around 50 miles north of Bend and is bordered on the north by the Metolius River and Lake Billy Chinook. (See Pine Application, p. 2.)³ According to Pine, the area gets its name from the confluence of three rivers in its northeastern corner; the Metolius River, the Deschutes River, and the Crooked River. (*Id.*) Pine states that the main roads are paved, and all regularly traveled roads are kept in good shape to approximately 132 homes and businesses. (*Id.*)

Supporting Reasons for the Transfer⁴

The reason for the requested transfer of allocated territory is that Qwest currently has no facilities and no customers in the Three Rivers area. Because the Three Rivers area is not near enough to existing Qwest facilities to permit Qwest to serve Three Rivers residents economically, without charging large line extension charges, Pine requests that the territory be transferred and allocated to it so that it can provide telephone service to the citizens of Three Rivers. Pine has represented to Qwest that it is willing to provide telephone service to the citizens of Three Rivers without charging them for construction of facilities. Accordingly, an order pursuant to the current request is the most efficient method for Pine to serve these residents.

Explanation Justifying why the Transfer will Not be Contrary to the Public Interest⁵

The transfer will not be contrary to the public interest. In fact, Qwest believes that this transfer is in the public interest because it will allow a single incumbent local exchange carrier to serve the area where Qwest does not have facilities and for which prospective Qwest customers would need to pay for construction or line extension charges in order to receive telephone service from Qwest. Further, because Qwest does not have any equipment or facilities in the area to be transferred, there are no current Qwest customers that will be impacted.

Franchises, permits or public authority approvals

Other than the requirements of the FCC, Qwest is unaware of the existence of additional requirements of approval of any public agency, other than this Commission, for the authority to unallocate and abandon and transfer territory in the state of Oregon. However, Qwest and Pine intend to jointly file, pursuant to 47 C.F.R. § 1.3 (section 1.3 of the Federal Communication Commission's ("FCC") rules), a request for a waiver of the definition of "study area" contained in the Appendix-Glossary of Part 36 of the FCC's rules after this Commission has approved their applications.

WHEREFORE, Qwest requests the Commission to issue an order 1) unallocating Qwest's rights to the exclusive territory identified herein and transferring such territory to Pine Telephone Systems, Inc., (2) allowing Qwest to abandon that same territory, and 3) approving Qwest's revised Culver Exchange map.

Dear Nancy:

This letter is in reply to your note to Rick Miller in our Halfway office.

- Pine Telephone is moving forward to acquire the unserved area from Qwest.
- · Qwest will be reimbursed by Pine Telephone for reasonable costs associated with accommodating the change. The costs would include the FCC's filing fees, costs to reviser the Culver exchange boundary map, and attorney and regulatory personnel time.
- We will submit to Qwest a written agreement that states Pine Telephone will assume the primary obligation for drafting any joint applications to the regulatory bodies that may be required.
- We will submit to Qwest a written agreement that states Pine Telephone will interconnect with Qwest at a mutually agreeable point of interconnection with minimal cost to Qwest.

The first regulatory step will be a joint petition by Qwest and Pine Telephone to the OPUC requesting approval of service area reallocation of the unserved western portion of the Culver exchange to Pine Telephone, followed immediately by a study area boundary waiver request to the FCC. Approval by the FCC of the waiver request is a requirement in order for Pine Telephone to afford the investment in plant for the unserved establishments there.

We must do a certain amount of field work in order to prepare an adequate estimate of required investment in plant to serve the area, plus identify a Point of Connection that has the least cost

impact on Qwest. We are certain we can do this without stirring the local population to making calls to Qwest about our presence there, but we want your approval prior to our making the field survey. Please let me know how we should proceed.

Dear Ron:

During our conference call on July 24, 2007 with Rick Miller of Pine Telephone, Nancy Batz of Qwest, and the Qwest engineers Luke French and Vickie Clay, the discussion centered on the establishment of a new meet point between the Three Rivers and Sisters exchanges.

We discussed that a good location for this new meet point would be the 1st manhole outside of the Sisters c.o. Pine Tel was in agreement with this location and Pine Tel agreed that it would trench and place conduit and fiber cable up to this location. A separate hand hole would be required (placed by Pine Tel) to separate each companies facilities for maintenance purposed in the future. Qwest will place a fiber cable between the Qwest manhole and the Pine Tel hand hole. All the trench work, fiber placement, establishment of a separate hand hole, and associated expense would be totally Pine Telephone System's responsibility. Pine Tel agreed to allow Qwest to place conduit in the trench, with no cost to Qwest, from that 1st manhole location out approximately 5.7 miles to about 9033 Wilt Road, Sisters, Oregon.

Pine Tel requested an OC48 optical system from Three Rivers to a Qwest c.o. of our choice. Qwest is in agreement with the OC48 optical system with future discussion on the required drops (OC3, DS3, VT1.5, etc). Each company would be responsible for their costs on the OC48 optical system and associated cards.

All this will be finalized once the OPUC approves each company's application However, Qwest requests written documentation from Pine Tel providing its concurrence for all of the above terms. If I have overlooked any items from our discussion, just provide them to me for Qwest's review.

I look forward to this future project with Pine Telephone System, Inc.
