III. DEFERRED ACCOUNTING RULE REQUIREMENTS

- 2 The following information is provided pursuant to the requirements set forth in OAR
- 3 860-027-0300(3).

- 4 A. Description of Utility Expense.
- 5 On December 14-15, 2006, Oregon experienced a dramatic windstorm, with winds
- 6 topping 90 mph in the coast range. The storm downed trees and power lines throughout the
- 7 state. An estimated 350,000 customers lost power throughout the State, including many
- 8 PacifiCorp customers.
- 9 The storm caused significant damage to PacifiCorp's power distribution network
- 10 throughout the State. PacifiCorp's first priority has been customer safety and power
- 11 restoration, so a complete assessment of the damage is not yet available. Based upon the
- 12 nature of the damage observed, however, PacifiCorp believes that its network has suffered
- 13 extensive damage. Without a clearer understanding of the nature and scope of the damage,
- 14 PacifiCorp is unable to determine which losses, if any, are covered by insurance.
- 15 B. Reasons for Deferral.
- PacifiCorp's request for deferral results from damage caused by a devastating storm.
- 17 In establishing generic guidelines for deferred accounting in UM 1147, the Commission
- 18 made clear that deferred accounting was designed to cover costs associated with this kind
- 19 of unpredictable and undeniably serious triggering event. See In re Investigation Related to
- 20 Deferred Accounting, Order No. 05-1070, UM 1147 (2005).
- 21 This Application for deferred accounting permits the Commission to support
- 22 PacifiCorp's efforts to responsibly respond to the December 2006 windstorm by immediately
- 23 addressing all safety and service concerns, and conducting a subsequent assessment of
- 24 damage and repair costs and options. In UM 1147, the Commission made clear that it had
- 25 discretion and flexibility to allow deferred accounting to encourage utility behavior consistent
- 26 with good regulatory policy. Order 05-1070 at 2.

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1	ORS 757.259(2)(e) allows the deferral of utility expenses or revenues where	
2	necessary to match appropriately the costs borne by and benefits received by ratepayers.	
3	This standard requires flexibility and an examination of the facts of the case. Order No. 05	
4	1070 at 4-5. This request seeks to align the costs of PacifiCorp's network service with the	
5	benefits customers receive from such service.	
6	C. Proposed Accounting.	
7	During the period of deferral, PacifiCorp proposes to account for the deferred costs	
8	of the Oregon IE by recording the deferral in Account 182.3 (Regulatory Assets). In	
9	accordance with ORS 757.259(3), PacifiCorp proposes to accrue interest on the	
10	unamortized balance at a rate equal to its weighted average cost of capital most recently	
11	approved by the Commission.	
12	D. Estimate of Amounts.	
13	PacifiCorp will supplement this Application with an estimate of the costs of the	
14	windstorm damage as soon as these are available.	
15	E. Notice.	
16	A copy of the Notice of Application and a list of persons served with the Notice are	
17	attached to this Application as Exhibit A.	
18	IV. CONCLUSION	
19	PacifiCorp respectfully requests that, in accordance with ORS 757.259, the	
20	Commission authorize the Company to defer the costs described in this Application.
